Day 1 Sturgeon Bay, WI

We travel across Minnesota and Wisconsin today to Sturgeon Bay. Upon our arrival, we'll check into our accommodations for the next two nights in Sturgeon Bay. Our resort is located just steps away from the wild Lake Michigan shoreline. Tonight, we'll enjoy included dinner at a local restaurant. (D)

Day 2 Sturgeon Bay, WI

A local guide will join us today for a tour of Door County. We'll begin with a lakeside drive featuring a visit to the classic and most popular lighthouse in Door County, Cana Island Light. Morning stops also include a guided tour of Boynton Chapel and a beach walk near the Ridges Sanctuary. Then we will enjoy lunch at the famous Al Johnson's Swedish Restaurant, where goats (yes, goats!) graze the sod roof atop this log cabin eatery serving traditional Swedish food. Afterwards, we'll drive through Peninsula State Park on the Niagara Escarpment, providing grand water views overlooking the Bay of Green Bay. We'll also visit and experience an authentic pioneer cemetery, located within the Park's boundaries and hear about some of the County's early inhabitants. Then stop at a local farm market and winery to bite into some fresh apples and sample some wine. We'll complete our day with a traditional Door County Fish Boil for dinner. (B, L, D)

Day 3 Mackinaw City, MI

This morning we depart Ellison Bay and travel through Michigan's Upper Peninsula. We drive across the "Mighty Mac," the bridge that connects the upper and lower peninsula's of Michigan. Upon arrival, we will check into our

accommodations for the next two evenings. The rest of the day is at your leisure. (B)

Day 4 Mackinaw City, MI

This morning we board Shepler's Ferry to cross to Mackinac Island. A local guide with a horse drawn carriage will pick us up at the ferry dock to give us a tour of the island including Fort Mackinac. Our lunch is included at the fabulous Grand Hotel. There will be free time this afternoon for you to browse this unique area that has no motorized transportation except a fire truck. We return to Mackinaw City by ferry later this afternoon. (B, L)

Day 5 Ludington, MI

We depart Mackinaw City and travel to the historic harbor of Manistee, Michigan for an included lunch. We'll continue south to Ludington and visit the Port Ludington Museum. Next, we'll satisfy our sweet tooth with homemade local jam at the Jam Farm. Just a mile away from Lake Michigan, it is the place to get all of the best jams, jellies, butters, marmalades and other homemade goodies! (B, L)

Day 6 Home

This morning we board the S.S. Badger for a cruise across Lake Michigan. After disembarking into Manitowoc, Wisconsin, we board our coach and head for home. (B)
